Our October meeting was outstanding! Vickie Shufer, a long time member of VNPS and a SHR board member, gave a wonderful presentation on the "Magic of Mosses – Carpet of Green.". She brought a diverse set of mosses for us to ooh and ahhh over. Mosses are ideal for shady locations with a wee bit of moisture. They are pest and disease resistant and provide habitat for insects, salamanders and frogs. Many of you are aware that Vickie has taken over the Virginian Pilot column covering wild and native things. Her column has been outstanding and she retains the photos and descriptions which have been a mainstay in the paper.

Our November meeting has changed to Thursday, November 7, due to the start of the Million Bulb Holiday Walk at Norfolk Botanical Garden (NBG). It will be held in *Rose Garden Hall* starting at 6:30 pm with refreshments and social time. We will have a *seed exchange* so please bring seeds from the natives in your gardens! We will also have a presentation by the Ruling Robot Falcons, a youth team which is planning a set of bumble bee habitat projects, mostly in Newport News to establish bee feeding waystations on public land to reduce fragmentation between areas where bees can forage and nest. Amy Nichols is leading the project; we will likely have to coordinate this with the John Clayton chapter, but we should view this as an opportunity to add South Hampton Roads to the target area.

We did have elections and approved donations at our October meeting. I agreed to stay on as President and Kathleen will continue as treasurer for two years. We still need a vice president as well as a social media chair. Susan Marens has agreed to join the board as a Director at Large.

We approved donations totaling \$1700 to several local groups and to the state VNPS organization to assist in printing local

native plant brochures for those areas which have limited members and funding for those brochures.
