#### Last Monthly Program This Spring

**6:45** Back to Warm Hearth. Ian will begin selling plants to VNPS members. When he is done, he will speak to our group. There is no special title to his talk. I left it up to him to decide what he wants to talk about.

**7:15** Ian's talk.

We usually don't have any regular programs between April and September, but I hope to arrange at least one talk at Warm Hearth for sometime this summer. If you have a suggestion for a program, let me know. Because we are hosting the big statewide VNPS Annual Meeting here September 9-11, *we will not start our regular monthly programs next fall until October.*

#### Progress for the September Conference
