
Thomas Jefferson Center for Historic Plants sale. Most sources list it as a wetland plant, but the Flora puts it everywhere from wetland to rocky woods, so we planted it on the bank between witch-hazels and Fothergilla.

Surprisingly for a first-year plant, it bloomed and green berries followed. The berries turned to a deep cranberry red, then (minus the one Betty took to get the paint color right) disappeared into the crop of some deserving bird. As the witch-hazels and Fothergilla turned yellow, a few Aronia leaves turned red.

Weird fact: Aronia can be distinguished from anything similar by the presence of trichomes. They're tiny fingers usually found on the mid-rib near the base of the leaf.
